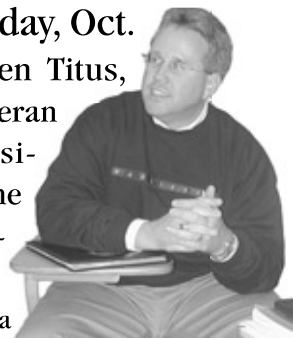


A Day in the Life
